WHAT ARE TREASURE TRAILS IN RUNESCAPE 2007?

Treasure Trails, also known as clue scrolls, are a popular form of content in OSRS that challenge players to follow a series of clues leading to a buried treasure or a reward casket. Each clue scroll is classified by

difficulty level: Easy, Medium, Hard, Elite, and Master. The higher the difficulty, the more steps you must complete and the better the potential loot, including unique items such as god d'hide armour, ranger boots, third-age equipment, and ornate jewellery.

Clues can be obtained from various sources—monster drops, skilling activities, or even from opening certain containers. Once you receive a clue scroll, you can read it to see the first clue. The clues come in different types: anagrams, coordinate clues, emote clues, puzzle boxes, and of course, cryptic clues. Among these, cryptic clues are often considered both the most interesting

and the most frustrating because they require you to interpret a riddle and figure out a specific location or action.

UNDERSTANDING CRYPTIC CLUES IN OSRS

A cryptic clue is a text-based riddle that points you toward a particular location, NPC, or item within the game world. The wording can be poetic, metaphorical, or obscure. For example, a classic cryptic clue might read: "I lie low, but I am high. My head is made of stone. My body is soft. I am often found in a city of guards." The answer to that riddle is a "soft clay" rock in the Meiyerditch mine, but only those familiar with the area might guess it immediately.

Cryptic clues have been part of RuneScape since its earliest days, and in Old School RuneScape, they remain largely unchanged from the 2007 version of the game (though some locations have been updated). Because of the large number of possible clues, even veteran players often rely on external guides or memorisation.

How Cryptic Clues Fit Into Treasure

Trails

When you start a treasure trail, you might encounter a cryptic clue at any step. In easy and medium clues, cryptics are relatively straightforward and often ask you to search a specific crate, bush, or tree, or to talk to an NPC while wearing certain items. In hard and elite clues, the cryptics become more complex, sometimes referencing obscure areas, underground locations, or items with unusual names.

Master clues are the pinnacle of difficulty and often include a mix of all clue types, including particularly tricky cryptics that may require you to solve a puzzle or perform an emote in a

specific place.

COMMON TYPES OF CRYPTIC CLUES IN RUNESCAPE 2007 TREASURE TRAILS

Over years of community research, players have categorised most cryptic clues into several patterns. Recognising these patterns can dramatically speed up your clue-solving process.

Location- Based Cryptics

These clues ask you to go to a specific geographical location and interact with something. For example, "In a town

where everyone has perfect vision, search the chests in the most northern house.” This might refer to “Eye” or “Sight” – a pun for “Meiyerditch” or “Canifis”? Actually, a classic example is “The town called ‘Eye’ is not far from here” pointing to the town of “Eye” in the Kingdom of Kandarin. You must know your OSRS map well to get these right.

Item-Based Cryptics

These clues require you to equip or bring a specific item to a certain location. For instance, “Search the crate in the house on the southern side of the castle. Bring a

white apron and a good amount of cash.” That could be a reference to the Varrock square bread stall area. As you advance, the items become rarer—like requiring a “dragon spear” or a “spined chaps”.

NPC Interaction Cryptics

Some cryptics tell you to speak to an NPC in a particular place while doing something. “Speak to the squire at the castle with a blue partyhat. You will need a lot of coins.” This type is common in medium clues and often involves the Falador castle squire or the Rimmington mine

guard.

Puzzle-Based Cryptics

These are a hybrid: the cryptic text leads you to a puzzle box, which you must solve to proceed. After you solve the puzzle, you often receive another clue. Many players find puzzle boxes tedious, so they use online solvers or train their speed.

HOW TO SOLVE RUNESCAPE 2007 TREASURE TRAILS CRYPTICS LIKE A PRO

Solving cryptics efficiently requires a combination of knowledge, tools, and practice. Here are the

most effective strategies:

Memorise Common Clues

Many cryptic clues repeat across different tiers. For example, the clue “I lie low, but I am high. My head is made of stone. My body is soft.” (the soft clay rock in Meiyerditch) appears in both easy and medium clues. If you do a lot of treasure trails, you will naturally memorise many of the common ones. However, with hundreds of possible clues, you’ll still need help for the outliers.

Use the OSRS Wiki and Third- Party Tools

Almost every cryptic clue in Old School RuneScape is documented on the OSRS Wiki's Treasure Trails page. You can search by the exact text of the clue. In addition, many players use the RuneLite plugin "Clue Scroll" which automatically highlights the solution location on the minimap when you read a clue. This is the most popular and efficient method for

solving cryptics quickly.

However, if you're playing on a vanilla client or mobile, you might need to manually look up clues on a phone or second monitor. Bookmark the OSRS Wiki's cryptic clue directory for quick access.

Understand Wordplay and Puns

Jagex designed many cryptics with clever wordplay. For example, "A town north of a gate, in a house with a bed, search the drawer." That could be the "Gate of the Slayer" in the north of the Lumbridge Swamp

– but the actual answer might be a house in “Taverley” or “Burthorpe”. Common wordplay includes homophones (e.g., “eye” for “I”), synonyms (e.g., “king” for “ruler”), or abbreviations (“lumbridge” as “lum”). Learning to think in puns is key.

Kharidian Desert. Having teleport runes, jewelry, a fairy ring network unlocked, and a spirit tree planted will save you hours. Players who optimize their clue running can complete an elite clue in under 10 minutes, largely because they know the quickest routes.

Keep a Swift Travel Method Ready

Many cryptic clues are scattered across Gielinor. You might need to go to the far north in the Fremennik Province, then immediately to the

TIPS FOR EFFICIENT TREASURE TRAILING

1. **Organise your inventory:** Keep

a clue loadout with teleport items, a knife, spade, light source, and a few coins. As you progress to hard and elite clues, you may also need specific weapons, armour, or quest items.

2. **Use the “Clue” item:** Carry the clue scroll in your inventory at all times during a trail. Reading it again will bring up the clue text if you forget.
3. **Solve puzzle boxes offline:** If you have an alt or a phone, use a puzzle solver to avoid wasting time.
4. **Know your fairy ring codes:** Many

cryptic clues point to locations near fairy rings. Having the full network unlocked (A Fairy Tale Part II quest) is almost mandatory for efficient hard/elite clues.

5. **Check the market for clue rewards:** Some items like ranger boots or third-age pieces are extremely valuable, but the real value comes from the dopamine rush of completing the trail.

THE EVOLUTION OF CRYPTICS IN OSRS

While the core of RuneScape 2007 Treasure Trails cryptics remains the same as

the original 2007 game, Jagex has added new clue steps over the years through updates. For example, the addition of the Kebos Lowlands and the Old School exclusive quests introduced new locations and items that appear in clue scrolls. Nevertheless, the majority of cryptics are unchanged from the classic era, which means that old guides from 2008 still apply to many steps.

Players often debate whether cryptics are outdated or unnecessarily difficult. But for most, the challenge is exactly what makes treasure trails so rewarding. Solving a cryptic clue without looking it up—using only game knowledge—is a true mark of an OSRS

veteran.

COMMON MISTAKES WHEN SOLVING CRYPTIC CLUES

- **Misreading the clue:** Some players rush and misinterpret “north-west of the bank” as “south-west.” Always double-check the direction.
- **Missing item requirements:** Hard clues often need a specific item equipped, like a yew shieldbow or a dragon battleaxe. Without it, the interaction won’t work.
- **Not having a light source:** Many cryptics

lead into caves or underground areas. Forgetting a tinderbox and candle can force a long bank trip.

- **Ignoring the coordinate clue unlock:** Some cryptic clues require you to have already solved a coordinate clue earlier in the trail. Be systematic.

CONCLUSION

RuneScape 2007 Treasure Trails cryptics remain one of the most engaging and rewarding aspects of Old School RuneScape. They blend puzzle-solving, exploration, and a deep knowledge of the game world into a compact challenge that can yield incredible loot.
