24. **Immortal Hearts (2020)** – Decker and Dani? (Wait, that was earlier. In fact, *Immortal Hearts* is a novella collection.)
25. **Morrigan's Bite (2021)** – **Actually part of a crossover series with Hannah Howell.** But set in the Argeneau world.
26. **Bitten by Love (2022) - Novella.**
27. **Werewolves and Vampires and Ghosts, Oh My! (2023) - The most recent full novel as of 2025.** – Focuses on a new couple.

Important note on earlier books: The first three novels were originally published in a different order (Singe

White Vampire first, then Love Bites, then A Quick Bite). However, most modern box sets and the author's own website recommend starting with *A Quick Bite* as it introduces the family more clearly. For the **best Argeneau reading order**, follow the numerical list above.

Argeneau Novellas and Short Stories
