How the Merger Changed the Channel Lineup

In 2016, Charter Communications completed its acquisition of Time Warner Cable and immediately began rebranding services under the Spectrum name. For Dayton subscribers, this meant new equipment, updated billing systems, and a phased

transition to the Spectrum channel guide. However, Charter made a concerted effort to keep channel numbers consistent so that customers would not have to relearn their favorite channel positions. For example, if you watched WHIO-TV on channel 7 under Time Warner Cable, you likely still find it on channel 7 or a very similar number with Spectrum. That said, some channels were rearranged, especially those in the higher-numbered tiers and the digital sports packages. This guide will help you bridge the gap between the old Time Warner Cable channel guide and the current Spectrum lineup.

LOCAL BROADCAST CHANNELS IN THE

DAYTON AREA

One of the most important sections of the Time Warner Cable channel guide for Dayton, Ohio, is the local broadcast lineup. These channels provide news, weather, sports, and network programming that is specific to the Miami Valley region. Whether you live in downtown Dayton, Kettering, Beavercreek, Centerville, or Huber Heights, these are the channels you rely on for hyper-local content.

- **WHIO-TV (Channel 7)** - CBS affiliate serving Dayton. Known for its trusted local news coverage, weather forecasts from

- **WBDT (Channel 26)** - The CW affiliate with a mix of prime-time network

- **WRGT (Channel 45)** – Fox affiliate providing local news and Fox sports and entertainment.

These local stations were consistently available in the basic and expanded basic tiers of the Time Warner Cable channel guide. Most remain in similar positions under Spectrum today, though some have shifted slightly due to digital transitions and bandwidth reallocation. If you are having trouble finding a specific local channel, using the on-screen guide menu and searching by network name is the fastest way to locate it.

NETWORKS AND THEIR CHANNEL NUMBERS

Beyond local broadcast channels, the Time Warner Cable channel guide for Dayton, Ohio, featured a robust selection of cable networks. - **Fox Sports Ohio (Channel 34)** – Regional sports network covering the Cincinnati Reds,

Columbus Blue Jackets, and Cleveland Cavaliers. This is a must-have for Dayton sports fans.

- **NFL Network (Channel 37)** – Exclusive NFL games and analysis.

PREMIUM CHANNELS AND MOVIE PACKAGES

For subscribers who wanted more movies and exclusive series,

the Time Warner Cable channel guide in Dayton, Ohio, offered several premium channel tiers. HBO, Showtime, Starz, and Cinemax were available as add-on packages, and each had its own dedicated channel numbers. Under the classic lineup, HBO typically appeared around channel 300, with multiple feeds for HBO East, HBO West, HBO Family, and HBO Signature. Showtime was usually in the 310 range, Starz around 320, and Cinemax near 330. These channels were also available in high definition, which leads us to the next important section.

HIGH-DEFINITION CHANNELS IN THE DAYTON LINEUP

As high-definition

television became the norm, Time Warner Cable expanded its HD offerings throughout Dayton. By the mid-2010s, nearly every major network and popular cable channel was available in HD. The HD channels were typically placed in a separate range, often starting in the 700s or 800s, to distinguish them from standard-definition counterparts. For example, if ESPN was on channel 30 in standard definition, the HD version might be on channel 730. This dual-channel system allowed subscribers with older televisions to continue watching while those with HD sets could enjoy superior picture quality. Today, Spectrum has largely moved to a single HD feed for most channels,

but the legacy of the Time Warner Cable HD channel guide remains a useful reference for anyone who still uses older equipment.

USING THE INTERACTIVE PROGRAM GUIDE EFFECTIVELY

Navigating hundreds of channels can be overwhelming, but the Time Warner Cable channel guide came with an interactive program guide that made finding shows simple. The guide allowed you to scroll by channel, search by program title, filter by genre, and even set reminders for upcoming shows. In Dayton, the guide also included local listings for community access channels and public, educational, and governmental (PEG)

channels. To get the most out of your guide, familiarize yourself with these features:

- **Search**

Function: Type in the name of a show or movie to find upcoming airtimes.

- **Favorites List:**

Create a custom list of your most-watched channels for quick access.

- **Parental**

Controls: Lock channels or limit viewing hours to manage what your family watches.

- **DVR**

Integration: If you had a Time Warner Cable DVR, you could record shows directly from the guide.

TIPS FOR FINDING YOUR FAVORITE CHANNELS TODAY

If you are a Dayton resident who still thinks in terms of the Time Warner Cable channel guide, you can easily adapt to the Spectrum lineup. Most channel numbers have stayed the same, especially for local broadcast stations and major cable networks. If you cannot find a channel, try these troubleshooting steps:

1. **Use the Voice Remote:** Simply say the network name, and the guide will display the correct channel.
2. **Check the Online Channel Lineup:** Visit the Spectrum website and enter your

Dayton ZIP code to see a full list of available channels.

3. **Contact Customer Support:** Representatives can walk you through any changes specific to your neighborhood.
4. **Scan for Updates:** Sometimes a simple equipment reboot will refresh the channel guide and restore missing channels.
