He breaks down the economics for us. "A beginner might earn a few hundred dollars for a scene. A top-tier performer with a large social media following can command thousands. But you have to remember, that one scene might be your only income for the month. There is no paid vacation, no health insurance, no retirement plan. You have to be a savvy businessperson to survive." Marc advises anyone considering the industry to study contracts carefully and never sign anything without a lawyer's review. "The biggest mistake I see young performers make is signing away their rights to their image forever. Once it's on the internet, it's out of your control." Physical Health, Safety Protocols, Social Media,

Health and safety are paramount in the modern adult industry, despite what many detractors claim. Marc walks us through the rigorous testing protocols that have become standard. "Every performer is tested for STIs every 14 days, sometimes more frequently. You cannot work without a current, clean test result. The entire production schedule revolves around testing dates. If one person's test is delayed, the whole shoot can be canceled."

He explains that the industry's testing system is often more stringent than in general healthcare. "We have a database that producers check before every scene. "There is a 'no means no' policy that is strictly enforced. If a performer is uncomfortable with a specific act or a partner, they can walk off set without penalty. This is a professional environment, first and foremost."

He explains the challenges of navigating these platforms while maintaining a public persona. "You are constantly walking a tightrope. You have to engage with fans, promote your work, and avoid getting banned by algorithms that are hostile to adult content. It's exhausting. You are never truly off the clock." Marc also notes the rise of direct-to-consumer platforms like OnlyFans and ManyVids. "Those platforms have given performers unprecedented control over their income and their image. But they also come with the burden of being your own producer, editor, accountant, and customer service representative."

"Find friends inside and outside the industry who love you for who you are, not what you do for a living." Finally, have an exit strategy. "This career has a shelf life. Have a plan for what you will do when you stop performing. Invest your money. Go back to school. Have a life outside of the lens."
