While everyone loves a sloth, the two-toed sloth is sometimes referred to as an unau, though this is an older term. However, it is a great addition to our list of animals that start with U for kids. The two-toed sloth lives in the rainforests of Central and South America. As its name suggests, it has two long, curved claws on its front feet. These claws are perfect for hanging upside down from tree branches. Sloths are famous for being very slow. They move so slowly that algae sometimes grows on their fur, which helps them blend in with the green leaves and hide from predators like harpy eagles

and jaguars. They sleep for up to 15 hours a day and only come down from the trees about once a week to go to the bathroom. Teaching kids about the unau helps them understand the concepts of adaptation and energy conservation.

BIRDS BEGINNING WITH U
