THE COMPLETE 7 DAY WEIGHT LOSS DIET PLAN

- **Fried Foods:** French fries, fried chicken, and tempura. They are calorie-dense and inflammatory.
- **Excessive Alcohol:** Alcohol provides calories and can lower inhibitions, leading to overeating.

VALUABLE TIPS FOR MAXIMIZING YOUR RESULTS

Following the meal plan is the core of your strategy, but other lifestyle factors can dramatically enhance your results. These tips are integral to the success of any 7 day weight loss diet plan.

Hydration is Non-Negotiable
